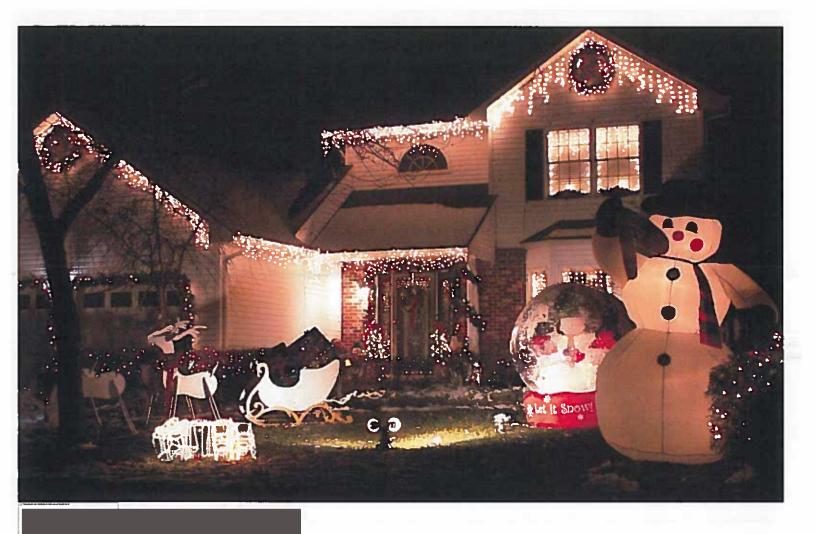

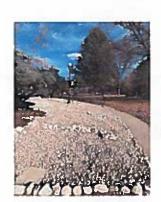

### \$5,000 Home Repair Grants Available to Support Westminster Residents in Need

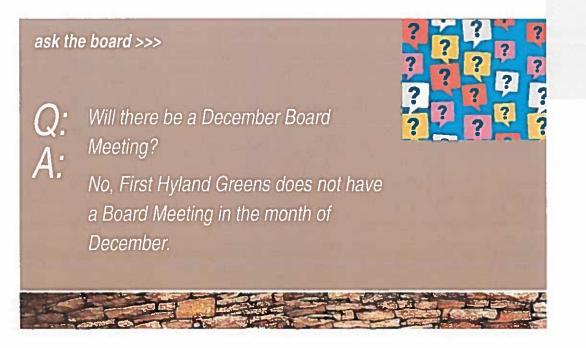

# **Covenant Corner**

#### SURPRISES, OR NOT

A surprise is defined as an "unexpected or astonishing event, fact, or thing." Good surprises are enjoyable, bad surprises not so much. In our neighborhood you are surrounded by 490 of your neighbors, each of which I am sure would enjoy a good surprise as opposed to a bad surprise. Likewise, I doubt you would like a bad surprise. For example, if you chose to paint your house in yellow and pink stripes, that may be a less than good surprise for your neighbors. If your neighbor painted her house in yellow and pink stripes, that would be a less than good surprise for you.

Consequently, to head off the ramifications of bad surprises, the neighborhood has covenants and regulations that encourage harmonious and peaceful coexistence. And to ensure that you receive no bad surprises when you attempt to paint your house in yellow and pink stripes, or improve your property in other meaningful ways, here are the categories of regulations that will apply to your decisions:

Fences;

Outbuildings;

Additions:

Decks and Patios;

Coolers and Air Conditioners;

Driveways;

Paint:

Siding;

Roofing;

Antennae:

Exterior Lighting;

Pools and Hot Tubs;

Skylights;

Solar Panels;

Vehicles;

Signs.

Before you think this is an intrusive attack on your privacy, I suggest looking at it from the viewpoint of what your neighbor might want to do that would upset you. In other words, this list addresses exterior elements of the home that influences the neighborhood, your home, and my home.

At the present time, your guidelines/regulations are being updated to reflect changing government mandated regulations and laws in addition to adding improved clarity to the association guidelines and covenants. As these sections are completed, they will be published in this newsletter. The existing documents are available on the HOA website. Simply stated, if you know what the guidelines/regulations are before you start a project, that is a good thing and perhaps no surprise is the best surprise after all.

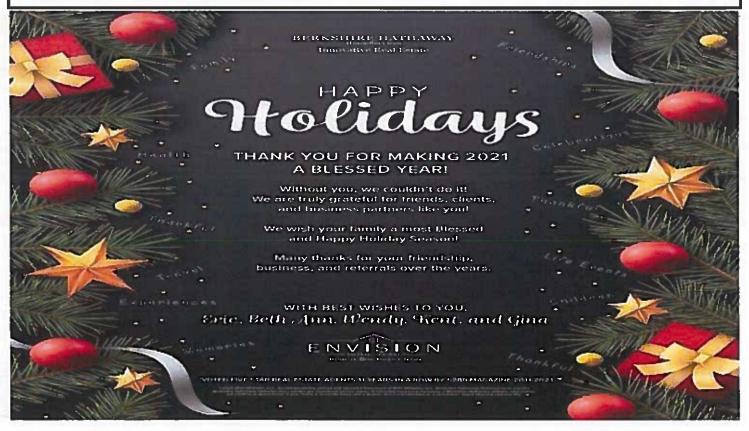

#### **SLOWING SALES CREATE OPPORTUNITY**

After an astonishing 114 consecutive months of year-over-year home price gains, existing home sales eased two percent on a seasonally adjusted annual rate between July and August 2021. Have rising home prices finally become too much for homebuyers? Not yet. The median existing-home sales price rose 15% year-over-year, according to The National Association of REALTORS (NAR), largely due to a continuing dearth of available homes for sale. Existing supplies nationwide are at a meager 2.6 months on hand, which means that at the current sales pace, supplies would end quickly. Most impacted by slim inventories and rising prices are first time buyers who accounted for 29% of sales in August, down from 30% in July and down from 33% a

year ago in August 2020. So, what does this mean for you – the homebuyer who may feel discouraged? Lawrence Yun, NAR's chief economist, said that "potential buyers are out and about searching, but much more measured about their financial limits, and simply waiting for more inventory." With winter approaching, housing sales tend to slow, especially with holidays pending. This affords buyers more opportunity to purchase a home "in the off season." In addition, when buyers are pushed to their limits, they begin to withdraw from the hunt, leaving sellers with fewer showing and offers.

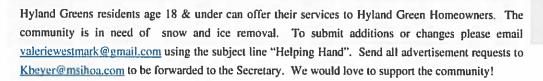

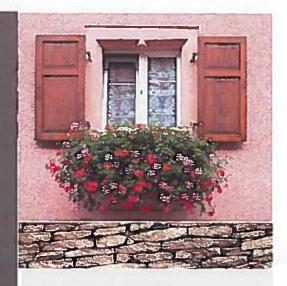


# finalthoughts...
